Lunch, activity, and field trip fees are included in tuition.

Wooster offers several payment plans. All first payments are due July 1st. Deposits and tuition payments for the 2021-22 school year will be made online through SmartTuition. A **non-refundable** 10% deposit required at the time of enrollment.

Books (Grades 5-12)

Textbooks are not included in the tuition and must be purchased separately. Information about ordering options will be sent at the time of course registration.

Technology (Grades 5-12)

All students in grades 5-12 are required to bring a family-supplied laptop computer to school on a daily basis.

Additional Note: Additional fees for bussing, college testing (PSAT, SAT, AP, ACT), lost library books, athletic equipment, special events, breakage/damage, etc. will be billed on your monthly statement as incurred.

Note: Tuition Refund Plan (TRP) is required for families who do not pay the 2021-2022 tuition in full by July 1. TRP is 2.1% of the contract amount. For more information call the Business Office at 203-830-3912.

10-payment Plan Fees:

The 10-Month Payment Plan carries a 6% interest rate on the declining balance.

Optional Expenses

Bus Service (Outside of Danbury)
